

POLONSKY FOUNDATION-NYU DIGITAL HUMANITIES INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

The Polonsky Foundation-NYU Digital Humanities Internship Program competition is closed.

Program Overview

Through the generous support of the Polonsky Foundation, NYU's Graduate School of Arts and Science, the Wasserman Center for Career Development, and NYU Libraries are partnering to establish an internship program to provide graduate students with diverse scholarly and professional interests with foundational knowledge and skills to be productive interns in the field of digital humanities.

Interns will have an immersive experience in professional project development in any area of the digital humanities, from data design and archival preservation to digital publication and public humanities. Interns will be matched with projects at NYU or an external internship site, as relevant to their areas of scholarly and professional interest. (If the applicant wishes to pursue a specific internship site and/or project, that should be specified in the proposal.)

Interns will receive a taxable honorarium of \$5,000 for participating in the program, and will be expected to dedicate approximately 300 hours for the internship during the summer months of 2015. Internships may extend into the Fall 2015 semester, depending on project needs and student availability. Interns must also commit to attending Digital Humanities workshops and Professional Development seminars on campus, beginning in March 2015. Internship projects will receive dedicated support in using digital humanities methods and tools, as well as on-going project management support by NYU faculty and the Digital Scholarship Services at NYU Libraries. Master's and doctoral students enrolled in GSAS, who will have completed 16 credits by June 1, 2015, are eligible to apply. Interns must remain matriculated in their graduate programs for the duration of the internship.

Submission Instructions and Deadline

NYU Application Deadline: Applications will be accepted and considered on a rolling basis until Monday, March 2.

Submit the application in a single scanned PDF format (with the exclusion of the letter of recommendation, which will be submitted by the faculty member) via email to gsas.fellowships@nyu.edu.

Complete applications should total no more than 1000 words (excluding CV, recommendation, and transcript) and include:

- Biographical statement of applicant's areas of scholarly and professional interests in the digital humanities, including relevant experience
- Brief description of learning goals and objectives for internship
- Digital tools, methods, and competencies the applicant wishes to develop
- One letter of recommendation from a faculty advisor in the applicant's academic department/program
- Current CV
- NYU transcript (official or unofficial copies accepted)
