Due December 18 - at midnight

1 In-Class Presentation

Every team and *every* team member should present. You will have the following amount of time:

- 1 person project: 4 min presentation, 1 min Q&A,
- 2 person project: 6 min presentation, 2 min Q&A,
- 3 person project: 9 min presentation, 2 min Q&A,
- 4 person project: 12 min presentation, 3 min Q&A.

Given the shortness of the presentation, you should make sure to rehearse it well. You need to know exactly what you want to say on every slide - otherwise you will run out of time and I will have to interrupt you. You should probably have 1 slide each on the following topics:

- Problem Setting,
- Evaluation Metric,
- Related Work/Baselines,
- Your Approach,
- (Preliminary) Results.

You don't need to have your final results yet. Use the presentation to structure your own thoughts and also to get feedback and ideas that you can incorporate into your final write-up.

- : 1 person project: 6 pages,
- : 2 person project: 8 pages,
- : 3 person project: 10 pages,
- : 4 person project: 12 pages.

Note that all your text and figures need to fit within the page limit (without messing with font sizes and margins), but you can have additional pages for the references.
