

# HOW TO GET TO THE APARTMENT



## FROM VERONA PORTA NUOVA TRAIN STATION

- Take the bus from Sidewalk D2; the stop is Porta Borsari/Via Diaz. From there, you will reach the apartment in just a couple of minutes on foot.
- Taxi, you will find them right outside the station.
- Walking distance to the apartment: approximately 25 mins



## FROM VALERIO CATULLO AIRPORT

- Aerobus 199 connects the airport to Verona Porta Nuova station, from where you can take the bus mentioned above.
- Taxi from the airport to the apartment (about 30 minutes)



## IF YOU ARE TRAVELING BY CAR

I recommend the Saba Arsenale Car Park. It's just one bridge away from the apartment!  
(about a 5-minute walk!)

# HABITS AND CUSTOMS

SOME LOCAL TIPS TO HELP YOU MAKE THE MOST OF YOUR TRIP: CULTURAL HABITS, CUSTOMS AND PRACTICAL TIPS



**Book ahead** - Reserve popular attractions online to avoid long lines. Make restaurant reservations in advance to avoid missing out.

**Watch out for pickpockets** - Be extra careful in crowded places. Verona is a very safe city; however, act as you would in any other tourist city in the world and be cautious of pickpockets.

Streets in the historic center often have cobblestones — **wear comfortable shoes!**

**Dinner times** in Italy are generally relaxed; however, restaurants adapt to tourists by starting to seat guests from around 6 or 7 pm.

In Italy, **opening times vary** widely by season, region and type of venue. Whether it's a cultural site, a restaurant or a shop, always check hours in advance online or with locals to avoid surprises.

Unlike in some countries, **tipping in Italy** is generally not mandatory. Service charges (called "coperto" or "servizio") are often included in the bill. Just leave a tip if you really appreciated the service, possibly hand it directly to the waiter you want to reward.

Many cities have **limited traffic zones (ZTL)** — avoid driving in them unless you have a permit. Be My Guest apartment is located in a ZTL area, reach out for parking recommendations.

Check if your travel dates coincide with **local festivals** — they are colorful and fun but can affect shops opening hours or traffic circulation.

**Use local transport apps or website** - like Trenitalia, Italo, Apptaxi, or Google Maps help navigate trains, buses and taxis. If you have a train/bus paper ticket, validate them before boarding, or risk a fine.

Learn a few **basic italian words** :) just saying "Buongiorno" (Good morning), "Per favore" (Please), and "Grazie" (Thank you) goes a long way. Locals appreciate the effort, even if they speak English!

### ARENA DI VERONA - PIAZZA BRA

Built in the first century AD, the Verona Arena is an open-air Roman amphitheater originally used for gladiator fights. Nowadays, It's still fully in use! You can attend unforgettable concerts and opera performances:

### PIAZZA DELLE ERBE

Literally Herbs Square, it's the ancient Roman forum of Verona. It has always been the heart of the city, a meeting place for locals and visitors alike, where you can enjoy an aperitif and chat with friends in an enchanting setting. Surrounding it, buildings and monuments of every era and style make it an unmissable stop on any visit to Verona.

### VIA MAZZINI

A stone's throw from the Arena, I recommend taking the central Via Mazzini, a beautiful street that connects the two main squares of Verona: Piazza Bra and Piazza delle Erbe. Via Mazzini is ideal for shopping, or simply to admire the shop windows. It is also lined with wonderful old buildings - don't get distracted!

### JULIET'S HOUSE

A few meters from Piazza delle Erbe, you will find yourself in front of the famous Juliet's house. Even before entering the courtyard, you will notice the walls covered with notes and love letters left by lovers from around the world. Above, you will see the famous balcony; below, according to legend, Romeo declared his love to Juliet!


## TOP ATTRACTIONS



### CASTELVECCHIO CASTLE AND MUSEUM

05

It's a fortified medieval structure that once served as the defense of the ruling Scaliger family. Nowadays, the Castelvecchio Museum is housed within this powerful and beautiful castle. As you walk across the bridge, take time to climb the steps and admire the breathtaking view through the brick windows!



### PONTE PIETRA


Literally Stone Bridge, it's the first construction built by the Romans when they arrived in Verona in the first century B.C. It is notable for the combination of two different materials: the original white stone and the bricks that replaced sections damaged by floods and wars. The bridge still preserves the characteristic Roman 'donkey-back' shape

### TEATRO ROMANO

07

The theatre was built in the late 1st century BC. Before its construction, two walls were built alongside the Adige River to protect it from floods. Today, only the remains of the edifice are visible, having been uncovered starting around 1830. These include the cavea and the steps, several arcades of the loggias, and the remains of the stage.



### CASTEL SAN PIETRO

The most breathtaking panoramic view of Verona. While the castle itself is not open to the public, the terrace in front of it is a must-see for visitors who want to take in the full beauty of the city. Whether you reach it by climbing the scenic stairs from Ponte Pietra or taking the funicular, the reward at the top is worth every step — especially magical at sunset!

### ARCHE SCALIGERE

These elaborate Gothic funerary monuments belong to the powerful Della Scala (or Scaligeri) family, who ruled Verona during the 13th and 14th centuries. The tombs are impressive examples of medieval Gothic architecture, richly decorated with pinnacles, statues, and symbolic details



### TORRE DEI LAMBERTI

Standing tall in Piazza delle Erbe, Torre dei Lamberti is Verona's tallest tower at 84 meters (275 ft). Built beginning in 1172 and extended over the centuries, it features a mix of Romanesque and Gothic styles.

You can reach the top by elevator or climb 368 steps to enjoy stunning panoramic views of Verona's rooftops, the Adige River, and the surrounding hills.

### GIARDINO GIUSTI

Giusti Garden is a beautifully preserved 16th-century Renaissance garden, renowned for its harmony and elegance. You'll find cypress-lined paths, mythological statues, fountains, and a charming hedge maze. As you ascend the terraced hillside, the view over Verona becomes increasingly breathtaking!

### LUNGADIGE

The Lungadige is a scenic riverside promenade that follows the curves of the Adige River as it flows through Verona. Whether you're walking, biking, or simply enjoying the view, the Lungadige offers a peaceful escape from the busier streets of the city. Locals love it for jogging, strolling, or sitting on a bench with a gelato. Follow the river, and you'll discover some of the city's most romantic corners.




### CHURCHES

#### DUOMO DI VERONA

13

The Duomo di Verona is the city's main cathedral, located in the historic center. It's a Romanesque church with Gothic and Renaissance additions, built on earlier Christian structures. It's a peaceful and historically layered place — not as massive as other Italian cathedrals, but full of charm and art.



#### SANTA ANASTASIA

Santa Anastasia is the largest and one of the most impressive Gothic churches in Verona, symbolizing the city's rich medieval history and artistic heritage. Commissioned by the powerful Dominican Order, it stands as a masterpiece of Veronese Gothic architecture.

#### SAN FERMO MAGGIORE

15

San Fermo Maggiore is one of Verona's most unique and atmospheric churches, combining two distinct levels — the Lower Church (Romanesque, 11th century) and the Upper Church (Gothic, 13th–14th centuries).

This layered structure offers visitors a rare opportunity to walk through centuries of sacred architecture within a single building.



#### BASILICA DI SAN ZENO MAGGIORE

One of the finest examples of Romanesque architecture in Northern Italy and a true jewel of Verona, the basilica is dedicated to San Zeno, the city's patron saint and eighth bishop, remembered for his humility and spiritual wisdom.

Located just outside the historic city walls, it is a peaceful and awe-inspiring place, rich in history, art, and architectural beauty.

## MUSEUMS

### PALAZZO MAFFEI - CASA MUSEO

A unique house-museum in a restored Baroque palace, showcasing over 650 artworks from antiquity to the 21st century. Highlights include a stunning self-supporting spiral staircase, a richly decorated noble floor with views over Piazza delle Erbe, and the striking contrast between old masters and avant-garde movements such as Futurism and Surrealism. Art lovers shouldn't miss it!



### ACHILLE FORTI GALLERY OF MODERN ART

Located inside the beautiful Palazzo della Ragione, just steps from Piazza delle Erbe, this gallery offers a peaceful and inspiring escape from the busy streets of Verona. It features an impressive collection of Italian modern art from the 19th and 20th centuries. One highlight? The view over Piazza dei Signori from the upper floors – a perfect blend of art, history, and scenery.

### CASTELVECCHIO MUSEUM

Housed in a 14th-century medieval fortress, Castelvecchio is Verona's premier museum of medieval and Renaissance art, beautifully restored by architect Carlo Scarpa. Inside, you'll discover paintings, sculptures, weapons, frescoes, and the famous equestrian statue of Cangrande I. The building itself – with its ramparts, towers, courtyards, and views over the Adige – is an essential part of the experience.



### NATIONAL ARCHAEOLOGICAL MUSEUM OF VERONA

This museum showcases ancient artifacts from Verona and its surroundings, spanning from prehistoric times to the early Middle Ages. Highlights include Roman sculptures, mosaics, funerary objects, coins, and tools – many unearthed during excavations at the nearby Roman Theatre.

# WHAT TO VISIT IN LAKE GARDA



Lake Garda is the largest lake in Italy, located only about 30 kilometers (19 miles) from Verona.

Not only is it spectacularly beautiful, with a wonderfully unhurried vibe, but it also offers plenty of activities and attractions to appeal to every type of traveler and budget. Whether you are a family, a couple, a history lover, a foodie, or even an adrenaline junkie, there's plenty to keep you busy here!



## BARDOLINO

01

Bardolino is a picturesque village on the eastern shore of Lake Garda, about 30 km (19 miles) from Verona. Nestled at the foot of the Morainic Hills, Bardolino is celebrated for its wine and olive oil production, and is a favorite destination for those seeking peace and relaxation.



## TORRI DEL BENACO

02

A covetable lakeside setting, a historic center, a pretty harbour, pebbly beaches, a medieval castle, and fragrant citrus groves backed by forested hills –Torri del Benaco is a charming pitstop for your Lake Garda exploration.

There are many restaurants along the lake, several of which have terraces over the water, allowing you to dine with a view

## MALCESINE

03

This compact, colorful town is a delight to walk through, with its narrow lanes, excellent shopping, and charming cafes and restaurants. Malcesine is most famous for its medieval castle, a 13th-century fortress perched on the shores of Lake Garda. Its narrow streets and old houses exude romance!



## SIRMIONE

04

Sirmione is the most popular attraction on Lake Garda. Upon entering the village, you are immediately greeted by the Scaligero Castle. Beyond the castle, narrow streets and alleyways await, offering a delightful exploration. Towards the northern end of the town, the peninsula is filled with trees, gardens, villas, and spas.

## DESENZANO DEL GARDA

Desenzano del Garda is a transportation hub on Lake Garda, not far from Sirmione. If you are traveling through Italy by public transportation and do not have a car, you can take the train to Desenzano and then use the ferries to explore Lake Garda. The town is also a charming place to visit, with its harbor, the Ponte alla Veneziana, and Porto Vecchio di Desenzano.



## LAZISE

The name Lazise comes from the Latin word laceses, which means 'city on the lake.' Observing the six towers of the Castello Scaligero and its walls, you can easily recognize the city's medieval origins. Lazise has a wonderful old town centre, with narrow alleys and picturesque squares, a harbour right in the city centre, and the 14th-century Veronese Customs Office.

## RIVA DEL GARDA

Riva del Garda makes a great base for exploring northern Lake Garda. It is a small, picturesque town situated on the northern shore of the lake, surrounded by mountains whose slopes blend into the blue waters. The atmosphere there is typically Mediterranean. If you have the chance, don't miss Lake Tenno, a true jewel of the Trentino landscape!



## CONNECTIONS VERONA-LAKE GARDA

From Verona, you can reach Lake Garda by train, with frequent daily connections offered by Trenitalia, Trenord, and Italo. Trains depart from Verona Porta Nuova station and arrive at Peschiera del Garda and Desenzano del Garda/Sirmione stations on the southern shore. To reach the northern shore, the closest station is Rovereto, about 18 km from the lake. Another option from Verona to Lake Garda is to travel by bus. Lines 162, 163, 164, and 165 of the Verona Transport Company (ATV) connect Verona (departures from Porta Nuova station) with Peschiera del Garda, Lazise, Bardolino, and Garda. From Garda, lines 483 and 484 continue to Torri del Benaco, Malcesine, and Riva del Garda. For timetables and more information, visit: [www.atv.verona.it](http://www.atv.verona.it)



# WHAT TO VISIT IN VALPOLICELLA



Valpolicella is a viticultural area in the province of Verona, Italy, located east of Lake Garda and north of the city. This hilly region, known for both agriculture and marble quarrying, is famous for its wine production. The Valpolicella wine region is made up of three geographical subzones: Classica and Valpantena, which border the Bardolino DOC vineyards on the banks of Lake Garda to the west, and Eastern Valpolicella, which extends towards the Soave DOC zone and the Po River.

Besides the wonderful wine, gorgeous scenery, and scrumptious food, one of the best things about the Valpolicella region is that it feels real and authentic. There aren't hordes of tourists, as you might find in other wine regions such as Chianti and Langhe. It gives you the feeling that you are witnessing true Italian life in a rural setting.

A car is helpful in this area. While public transportation is available, having a car gives you much more flexibility. Many of the vineyards are family-owned and require calling ahead to make an appointment for a visit. Others have signs indicating that you can simply drop by. My recommendation is to do a mix of both: make one or two appointments, but also be spontaneous and visit a winery that allows walk-ins.

There are more than 400 wineries in Valpolicella Classica, each with its own history, values, style, and character. If we also consider the broader Valpolicella wine-producing area, where in recent years a few top-quality wineries have emerged, the options for organizing a wine tasting become almost unlimited!

# WHAT ELSE TO VISIT IN VALPOLICELLA



## LESSINIA NATIONAL PARK

01

This natural park was established in the 19th century and is home to numerous natural features, museums, and an information center. It is a spectacular natural oasis of approximately 80,000 square meters, boasting enchanting waterfalls, ponds, and lush vegetation.



## SAN GIORGIO DI VALPOLICELLA

Built on a hill surrounded by vineyards and olive trees, the village offers spectacular panoramas that sweep all the way down to Lake Garda. At the heart of the village is a Romanesque church, one of the oldest places of worship in the Verona region, dating from the eighth century. The church was built on the ruins of a pre-existing pagan sanctuary.

02

## SAN FLORIANO AND ITS CHURCH

03

This church is located in San Floriano and represents the most interesting example of the Romanesque period in Valpolicella. The current building is the result of a reconstruction carried out after its destruction in the 11th-century earthquake. It features a beautiful tuff ashlar façade and an interior with three naves, including sections from the Roman era, which suggest that the site was previously home to a temple.



## THE WATERFALL PARK OF MOLINA

The ideal place for a nature excursion surrounded by greenery. The Waterfall Park of Molina covers an area of about 80,000 sqm, where meandering streams and waterfalls are home to a rich variety of plants and animals. The breathtaking cascades along the watercourses are easily accessible via the park's trails.

# WHAT TO EAT



## VERONA TRADITIONAL FOOD: FIRST COURSES



### RISOTTO ALL'AMARONE

Amarone Risotto is one of the most famous and beloved recipes of Verona's culinary tradition. It perfectly pairs two of the best local products: Amarone, a premium red wine produced in the hills near the town, and Vialone Nano, a superb white rice variety typical of the plains in the southern Verona province.



### GNOCCHI DI PATATE AND HOME MADE PASTA

Delicious, soft potato dumplings freshly made with premium ingredients. Light and airy in texture, they are extremely versatile and can be served with any sauce. In Verona, this dish has a special significance, as it is linked to an important tradition at the origin of the ancient Veronese Carnival. Homemade pasta of all kinds is also part of the tradition, including bigoli, fettuccine, pappardelle, and paccheri.



### TORTELLINI DI VALEGGIO

Tortellini are handmade individually using a thin sheet of pasta and a delicate meat filling. They are often called 'love knots' because of their knot-like shape. They are a must at any dinner or family gathering!



### RISOTTO AL TASTASAL

Tastasal, or Tastasale, is simply a mixture of fresh minced pork, salted and generously seasoned with black pepper.

The word 'Tastasal' comes from the Venetian dialect and literally means 'to taste the salt.' This refers to a traditional practice in the Veronese countryside, where women would taste the seasoned pork before stuffing it into sausages or making salami, to ensure the salt was just right.

# WHAT TO EAT



## VERONA TRADITIONAL FOOD: SECOND COURSES

Meat is very popular in Veronese cuisine. If you're vegetarian or vegan, feel free to skip this page and ask me for the best alternatives!



### LESSO CON LA PEARA'

There is no other dish that represents Verona more than pearà. In fact, pearà is not prepared in any other city or region. Pearà is a sauce made from breadcrumbs, generously seasoned with black pepper, and traditionally served with mixed boiled meats and vegetables. Other sauces that pair perfectly with meat include salsa verde, salsa cren, and mostarda.



### PASTISSADA DE CAVAL CON POLENTA

Pastissada de caval is an ancient horse meat stew that is today a specialty of Veronese cuisine. Due to its long cooking time, this dish is typically served as a second course on special occasions. When served, pastissada de caval is traditionally accompanied by creamy polenta.

Polenta also pairs wonderfully with a wide variety of other meats.




### BRASATO ALL'AMARONE

Brasato is beef or veal that is first marinated and then slowly braised in red wine and herbs. Brasato is a very elegant dish, traditional in the northern regions of Italy, where it can be prepared with different red wines: Barolo in Piemonte, Barbera in Lombardy, or Amarone in Veneto



# WHAT TO DRINK

## VERONA TRADITIONAL WINE



**Red wines are the jewel in the crown of Verona's wine industry. At the heart of these wines are different grape varieties, including Corvina, Rondinella, and Molinara, which give us wines such as Valpolicella (both Classico and Superiore).**

**If you are a wine lover, you must try:**

### **Amarone**

**represents an authentic excellence of the Valpolicella area. It is an intense red wine made from dried grapes. Expect bold aromas of cherry liqueur, black fig, carob, cinnamon, and plum sauce, along with subtle notes of green peppercorn, chocolate, and crushed gravel dust.**

### **Ripasso**

**is the result of an ancient peasant technique that involves re-fermenting Valpolicella wine with the grape pomace used to produce Amarone and Recioto. The resulting young wine has a particularly vigorous character, balanced by the sweet and ripe notes of dried grapes.**

### **Recioto**

**is considered the father of Amarone. This excellent dessert wine has a ruby-red color with purple hues. Warm and velvety, with cherry flavors, it is perfect for concluding a meal.**

**Although the Verona region is famous for its red wines, it also produces a number of excellent white wines**

### **Lugana**


**The taste of this popular white wine is just as fascinating as the breathtaking views over beautiful Lake Garda, where Lugana wine is produced. Delicate, dry, and fresh, the wine reflects the local layered clay soils, offering aromas of almond and apple, with medium body and a long, layered finish.**

### **Soave**

**Made from Garganega grapes grown around the medieval village of Soave, this wine is characterized by fruity notes, particularly apple and citrus, with subtle hints of white flowers and sage. Harmonious, sapid, and mineral, very elegant and pleasant, its acidity and a touch of almond are typical of this variety.**

### **Custoza**

**The name of this wine comes from a countryside village located in the southwestern corner of its municipality. On the nose, the most typical aromas are grapefruit, lemon, melon, pear, pineapple, and banana. On the palate, it is dry, with a balanced and harmonious flavor and acidity, slightly bitter, with a clean aftertaste.**




